The Trinity

Part 3: The Trinity in Us

Recapping Earlier

- The Christian Doctrine of God is that there is one God who is eternally three persons.
- These three persons are the one God.
- The persons are distinct, yet not separate.
- God is one, but never alone.
- There is only "Plan A."

Recapping Earlier

- •Jesus, the divine Son, has come to save us.
- The Father sends the Son, who then sends the Spirit
- The Spirit reveals the Son, who in turn reveals the Father.
- This is all done for us and for our salvation

God the Son became the Son of Man in order to make the sons of men the sons of God.

God the Son

- The Son is the Second Person of the Trinity
- This divine person is the one who became the man Jesus.
- This divine person possesses all the properties of the divine nature eternally.
- That is, he is, was, and always will be fully and completely God.

- This divine Son took on a full and complete human nature
- That nature was not another person, but was all the essential properties of being human.
- So, as the Trinity is one being/three persons,
 Jesus is one person/two natures

- Person vs. property (energy) vs. nature
- The person is the "who"
- The property (energy) is what the "who" does
- The nature is the "what" that the "who" is

- The divine nature has its properties
- The human nature has its properties
- The person is the "executor" of the properties of his nature.
- So Jesus "executes" two sets of properties, and both sets are his "by nature."
- Persons do things. Natures cannot do anything.

- Jesus, the Divine Son, experienced human things (hunger, fatigue, learning, death, etc.)
- •In Jesus, for the first time, the divine properties resided in a human (and still do!)

...in order to make the sons of men...

- Human beings do not possess the divine properties by nature.
- We can only participate in them because of the presence of God in us (grace).

...the sons of God

- The Holy Spirit, the great creator of koinonia (community), connects our humanity to that of Jesus.
- •We then share in the divine properties he experienced as a human.
- We do not need to create those divine properties!

Liberating gospel news

- If we are saved, then the Holy Spirit dwells in us.
- •If the Holy Spirit dwells in us, then all of the divine properties are present in us by participation.
- If the divine properties are present, we are called to live and move in them.
- Again, we do not need to create them.

Theological Recap

- •Jesus, as the "captain of our salvation," brought the divine properties permanently at home into humanity.
- •The Holy Spirit creates the communion between him and us, so that we participate in his human experience of the divine properties.
- The properties are his "property." We do not and cannot create them.

The Takeaway, part 1:

- •God's love does not begin with us. "We love him because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19).
- •God's peace does not begin with us. "My peace I give to you, not as the world gives" (John 14:27).
- •God's joy does not begin with us. "These things I have spoken to you, that my joy might remain in you and that your joy might be full" (John 15:11).

The Takeaway, part 2:

- •All the other divine properties do not begin with us either. 1 Cor 1:30: "But by [God's] doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption."
- •We don't have to manufacture any of it! The Holy Spirit brings it all with him!

The Takeaway, part 3:

- We have everything we need, right now, dwelling in us.
- If we don't feel like that is true, which is probably you in some way, be encouraged!
- Even if we do not feel it, the divine properties are with us, because the divine One is with us.

The Takeaway, part 4:

- It doesn't begin with you
- You don't create it, and you don't own it.
- You only participate in it, but it is no less real.

The Takeaway, part 5:

- If you are hurting, alone, troubled, confused, or anything else, and are saved, you already have the answer.
- Don't let the enemy lie to you. Don't lie to yourself. You already have what you need.
- God's gift is already in you.
