 - Conditioning: learn new habit patterns
 - •Think: "I'm a saint, not a saved sinner"

Watchman Nee

- You don't change at all!
 - You just haven't yielded yet
 - Christ lives His life through you
 - •If you are trying, you are not yielding
 - You should command sins to leave because they don't come from new life in Christ

The Apostle Paul

- You need to become what you are!
 - •In Christ, you are holy (1:22)
 - •In real life, not always
 - Reject the old and choose to live the new

- 1. Off with the Old (3:5-9)
- 2. On with the New (3:10-17)

The Apostle Paul's Application

- 1. Off with the Old (3:5-9)
 - What do we do with our old sin nature?
 - •Anderson: Ignore it?
 - Nee: Dismiss it?
 - Paul: KILL IT!

- A. Put the old to death (5)
 - •In Christ, you died to the old way of living life (2:20)
 - •In Christ, you were raised to a new way of living life (3:1)
 - You are in transition

- A. Put the old to death (5)
 - Sin starts in the heart (Mark 7:20-23)
 - Simply avoiding the act is not good enough (Matt. 5:21-28)
 - Simply avoiding the trigger doesn't work (Col. 2:21-23)

N. T. Wright

"The old taboos put the wild animals of lust and hatred ... in cages: there they remain, alive and dangerous, a constant threat to their captor. Paul's solution is more drastic: the animals are to be killed (3:5). The old method of holiness attacked the symptoms; the true method goes for the root."

- A. Put the old to death (5)
 - Recognize it
 - Evaluate your thoughts / temptations
 - James 1:13-15; 4:1-3
 - Take your thoughts captive
 - 2 Cor. 10:5-6

- A. Put the old to death (5)
 - Reject it
 - You are no longer a slave (Rom. 6:6; 16-18)
 - Sin only brings death (Rom. 3:23; Gal. 6:8)
 - Not suppression or management
 - Weed whacker vs. shovel

- A. Put the old to death (5)
 - Replace it
 - Slaves to righteousness (Rom. 6:15-19)
 - Set your mind on things above (Col. 3:1-4)
 - Think about the right things (Phil. 4:8)
 - Do the right things (Ephesians 4-5)

- A. Put the old to death (5)
 - Immorality all inappropriate sex
 - Impurity moral corruption (Rom. 1:24)
 - Passion uncontrolled selfishness
 - Evil desire corruption of good desires
 - Greed to have more; not good enough

- A. Put the old to death (5)
 - The constant choice: the flesh or The Spirit?
 - By choosing one, you reject the other
 - •Rom. 8:12-13; Gal. 5:16
 - Submit / sow to the Spirit (Gal.6:7-9)
 - Walk in the Spirit (Col. 3:7; Gal. 5:16-26)

Baker Commentary: Romans

"There is a paradox in this, however, for Paul recognizes that the old nature, though in principle put to death on the cross, lingers on in the life of the believer and can be overcome by the decisive will of the Christian who must choose to live according to the new nature, not the old."

- B. Put the old away (8)
 - •Lay aside; renounce; disarm (2:15)
 - Attitudes / reactions / responses (8)
 - Having put off, like a dirty shirt (9)
 - Lying to one another
 - Inconsistent with the new life (Christ)

- Lay aside; renounce
 - Anger internal; smoldering, seething
 - Wrath anger expressed externally
 - Malice personal animosity
 - •Slander blasphemy; reviling words
 - Abusive speech obscene; innuendo

2. On with the New (3:10-17)

- A. Having put on the new self (10)
 - The new life: Christ-like; holy; heavenly
 - •3:1-4; Eph. 4:20-24
 - New privileges / responsibilities (Phil. 3:20)
 - New desires (Matt. 5:6; Rom. 12:1)

2. On with the New (3:10-17)

- A. Having put on the new self (10)
 - Who is being renewed (progressive)
 - •To (in) a true knowledge (see 1:9-10)
 - •John 17:3; Prov. 2:1-6; 9:10
 - According to the image of the One who created him (Rom. 8:29; 13:13-14)

2. On with the New (3:10-17)

- A. Having put on the new self (10)
 - No distinctions / classes / caste
 - National: Greek / Jew
 - Religious: circumcised / uncircumcised
 - Cultural: barbarian / Scythian
 - Social: slave / free

So What?

- Am I actively pursuing holiness?
- Am I putting the old master to death?
- Do I entertain anger, wrath, malice, etc.?
- Am I growing in my knowledge?
- Is there any hint of prejudice?
