


The City of Thessalonica

- •Founded in 315 BC by Cassander
 - •Named for his wife (half-sister of Alexander the Great)
- Later made capitol of Macedonia
- Roman "free city": autonomy, no military occupation, tax exempt

The City of Thessalonica

- Most prominent Macedonian city
 - •Along the *Egnatian Way* a Roman military road and trade route
 - At the head of the best harbor
 - Very wealthy and prosperous
- Population approx. 200,000 (many Jews)

The City of Thessalonica

- Both Greek and Roman religions
 - Within sight of Mt. Olympus
 - •Much idolatry (see 1 Thess. 1:9)
 - Worship of Caesar (see Acts 17:6-9)
 - Religion was used to galvanize society

How Long was Paul's Visit?

- At least 3 weeks (Acts 17:2)
- Most likely longer
 - •Considering all that he taught them (e.g.
 - 1 Thess. 3:4; 4:1-3; 2 Thess. 2:1-5)
 - And his personal ministry (2:8-12)
 - •Help from Philippi (Phil. 4:15-16)



What Did He Do?

- •To the Jews:
 - •Reasoned in the Synagogue (17:2)
- •To Gentiles:
 - Most likely set up shop
 - •Insula: shop / apartment buildings
 - Artisans: Conversation while working

- He targeted important cities (1)
- According to Paul's custom (2-3)
 - •He went to the Jews first (Rom. 1:16; Acts 1:8; 3:26; 9:20; 13:5, 14)

- •He reasoned with them (2, 17)
 - •To speak back and forth; present intelligent discourse; Q & A
 - •Lost art in Postmodernism: "If I believe it, it is valid and 'true' so stop talking."
 - •Prov. 29:9

- •He reasoned with them (2, 17)
- From the Scriptures (2)
 - According to the Scriptures (1 Cor. 15:3-4)
 - •Example: Acts 13:13-41
 - •Jesus: Luke 24:25-27; 44-49



- •He reasoned with them (2, 17)
- From the Scriptures
 - •Explaining (to open the sense of a thing) and giving evidence (to set or lay before)
 - 1. The Christ had to die and rise again
 - 2. Jesus is the Christ



What Happened? (Acts 17)

- Many were saved (4)
- The Jews became jealous (5) and stirred up trouble (8)
- Paul and Silas snuck away to Berea (10)
- Jews from Thess. followed (13)
- Paul -> Athens; Silas & Timothy stayed (15)



What Happened?

- •Paul waited for them in Athens (16)
- Silas & Timothy joined him
- Paul feared for the Thess. believers and sent Timothy back (1 Thess. 3:1-5)
 - •Silas to Macedonia, too? (Acts 18:5)
- Paul went to Corinth alone (Acts 18:1)



In Corinth

- Stayed 18 months (Acts 18:11)
- Silas & Timothy from Macedonia (5)
 - Brought news from Thess. (1 Thess. 3:6)
 - Encouragement: standing firm! (3:8)
 - •Questions: Parousia? (4:13-5:11)

The First Letter to Thessalonica

- Purpose for writing:
 - 1. To encourage them to remain faithful in the face of opposition and adversity
 - 2. To answer their questions regarding the second coming of Christ

Why are we studying this?

- •"But we do not want you to be uninformed, brethren,..." (1 Thess. 4:13)
- We need to renew our minds with the Word of God
- God has revealed Himself and His plan in His Word (Acts 17:2-3)
