1. Keep on Loving

- •Commendation!
 - We don't have anything to add
 - You are taught by God (see 3:12-13)
 - You're doing it!
 - •Just don't be satisfied with that (see 4:1)
 - Urge: exhort, encourage, (comfort)

1. Keep on Loving

- Excel still more
 - •Abound (see 3:12; 4:1)
 - •Jesus is causing it, to fix in holiness
 - •This is how He brings about the *life* He came to give (see John 10:10)



1. Keep on Loving

- Part of how to please God (4:1)
 - Loving is being like God, which pleases
 Him (1 John 4)
- Part of freedom in Christ (Gal. 5:13-15)
 - Through love serve one another

- Lead a quiet life
 - •Quiet: still, peace, silence, rest
 - •Irony: Strive eagerly to live a calm life
 - •Why were some agitated?
 - Affliction / oppression? (3:3-4)
 - •Second coming? (see 4:13-5:11)

- Lead a quiet life
 - •Quiet: still, peace, silence, rest
 - Strive for a peaceful, tranquil life
 - Rest in God take Him at His Word
 - There's no need to be restless, excited, agitated, or offended

- Quit the Drama!
 - •Drama = desire for some crisis, some affront, some slight, some conflict, etc., to use as a tool against others
- •Rom. 12:14-21

GET OVER YOURSELF!

- •What's the fruit of the Spirit?
 - •Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control
 - •If your life is crazy, maybe you're not walking by the Spirit (Gal. 5:19-23)

- •To do one's own
 - Take care of your own affairs
 - 1. Don't be a mooch: if you are fulfilling your responsibilities you will not be a burden to someone else



- •To do one's own
 - Take care of your own affairs
 - 1. Don't be a mooch
 - •There is a good self-sufficiency (Phil.
 - 4:11; 2 Cor. 9:8; 1 Tim. 6:6)
 - •Sharing Acts 4:34-35; Eph. 4:28
 - Implies asking (both ways)



- •To do one's own
 - Take care of your own affairs
 - 2. Don't be a meddler: if you are busy doing what you should you won't have time to stick your nose into someone else's affairs

- •To do one's own
 - Take care of your own affairs
 - 2. Don't be a meddler
 - •E.g. 1 Tim. 5:13-14
 - •Proper balance Phil. 2:4
 - •Sin requires action Matt. 18:15-35; 1 Cor. 5; Col. 3:16; 2 Thess. 3:6-15



4. Get Busy

- Work with your hands
 - •Manual labor (i.e. don't be idle)
 - •Why were some idle?
 - Affliction / oppression? (3:3-4)
 - •Second coming? (see 4:13-5:11)
 - Culture? (see Acts 17:21)

4. Get Busy

- Work with your hands
 - •Manual labor (i.e. don't be idle)
 - •Paul's example (2:9-10)
 - •Paul's instruction (5:14; 2 Thess. 3:6-15)
 - •Instruct or warn those who are neglectful of their duties; keep away from them

5. And Here's Why

- Just as we commanded you
 - Charges, orders, instructions (4:2)
 - Part of walking to pleasing God (4:1)
 - •To God's glory (1 Cor. 10:31)
 - •Word hard! (cf. Col. 3:22-25)

5. And Here's Why

- 1. So that you behave properly
 - •Behave: walk, conduct (2:12, 4:1)
 - Properly: orderly, decently, in good fashion; i.e. - decorum, propriety
- •Toward outsiders we represent Christ and the gospel (1 Tim. 3:7; Titus 2; 1 Pet. 2:12)

- 5. And Here's Why
- 2. So that you will not be in need.
 - Undue or unnecessary burden on others
 - •THERE ARE LEGITIMATE NEEDS! (2 Cor. 8)
 - Cannot be idle, lazy, imposing
 - •Leon Morris: "...he is making the point that the Christian cannot be a parasite."

So What?

- •God's invitation to real life
 - •Holiness, love, peace, industry, sharing, ...
- •Looking for ways to excel still more in love?
- •What needs to change to quit the crazy?
 - •Focus, desires, attitude? Trust, rest?

So What?

- •Am I busy or a busy-body?
- •Do I think about non-believers and look for opportunities?
- Am I serving any other gods, or seeking to please the living and true God in everything?
