Passion •Merriam-Webster Dictionary: Intense, driving, or overmastering feeling or conviction Emotions as distinguished from reason The state or capacity of being acted on by external agents or forces (suffer)

The Passion of Our Savior Mark 15:21-47

Mark 15:21-47 Timeline of the Passion: 1. Early: 6 AM - 9 AM (1-21)2. Third Hour: 9 AM - 12 PM (22-32) 3. Sixth Hour: 12 PM – 3 PM (33) 4. The Ninth Hour (34-41) 5. Evening: 3 PM – 6 PM (42-47)

6 AM - 9 AM Sanhedrin met early (1a) Formal condemnation and charges •They took Jesus to Pilate (1b) Time for civil business (like executions) Accusations and questioning (2-5) •Jesus rejected / Barabbas released (6-15)

6 AM – 9 AM

Scourging and mocking (15-20)
How long did this last?
Simon pressed to carry Jesus' cross (21)
Known in Rome? (see Rom. 16:13)

9 AM – 12 PM •Jesus taken to Golgotha (22) •The place of the skull •Refused wine with myrrh (23) •Narcotic affect, either to (1) deaden pain, or (2) make victim more compliant

9 AM – 12 PM

And they crucified Him (24)
Absolutely cruel, slow death (2-3 days)
Every breath was torture
Exhaustion, hypercarbia, asphyxiation

9 AM – 12 PM •Cast lots for His clothing (24; Ps. 22:18) Five articles of clothing / four soldiers Inscription: THE KING OF THE JEWS Most likely to mock the Jews/Sanhedrin Yet it proclaimed the truth to the world

9 AM - 12 PM Two robbers - most likely insurrectionists with Barabbas (27; see John 18:40) Abused by passersby (29-30) Mocked by chief priests & scribes (31-32) Both groups: "Save Yourself!" Insulted by the two robbers (32)

12 PM – 3 PM

•darkness fell over the whole land (33) •What was this darkness? Eclipse was impossible. Like in Egypt (Ex. 10:21-22)? Like at Mt. Sinai (Deut. 4:11; 5:23)? •Whole land = Jerusalem, Israel or whole earth?

12 PM – 3 PM

 darkness fell over the whole land Nothing else recorded for these 3 hours •Was this the time of God's wrath? Darkness & Judgment (e.g. – Joel 2:31) •He was made sin for us (2 Cor. 5:21) and a curse for us (Gal. 3:13)

The Ninth Hour •When did the darkness lift? (33) Jesus cried out with a loud voice (34) • "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAVE YOU FORSAKEN ME?" (Ps. 22:1) No break in the Trinity Anguish and hope (Ps. 22)

The Ninth Hour Cry mistaken as a call for Elijah (35) •Given sour wine (36; cf. Ps. 22:15) Another loud cry (37a) "It is finished!" (John 19:30) •Breathed His last (37b; Luke 23:46) •Dismissed His spirit (John 19:30; cf. 10:18)

The Ninth Hour

•Time of evening sacrifice (cf. Num. 28:4) And Passover sacrifice (cf. Ex. 12:6) Temple veil torn from top to bottom (38) •Handbreadth thick, 30 feet high •Opened the Holy of Holies (Heb. 6:19-20; 10:19-22)

The Ninth Hour The centurion (39) In charge of the three 4-man squads • "Truly this man was the Son of God!" (39) •The women (40-41; cf. 47; 16:1) Important eyewitnesses (47)

3 PM – 6 PM

• Evening – from the sacrifice till sundown •"the preparation day, that is, the day before the Sabbath" (42) Sabbath laws took affect at sundown Preparations for no work the next day

3 PM - 6 PM•Lev. 23:1-8 Work 6 days -- seventh is Sabbath (3) • Passover – 14th day of first month (5) •At twilight - 'sunset' (Deut. 16:6) According to Josephus: 3-6 pm •Unleavened Bread – 15th thru 21st day (6) •One week, starting on the Sabbath (7-8)

3 PM - 6 PM Joseph of Arimathea (43) "He had not consented to their plan and action" (Luke 23:51) •Waiting for the Kingdom (Messiah) Recognized Jesus, but was afraid to go public (John 19:38)

3 PM - 6 PM Joseph of Arimathea (43) •He gathered up courage •Pilate (44) •Jesus dead in less than seven hours? •The centurion (39, 44, 45) •Fully responsible, on pain of death

3 PM - 6 PM Joseph took the body (46) •Unclean for Passover (cf. John 18:28) Didn't know/understand Jesus would rise from the dead Placed Jesus' body in his own tomb (Matt. 27:60; cf. Isa. 53:9)

So What? •Why did Jesus die? •Love (John 3:16; Rom. 5:8, et al) •A ransom for many (Mark 10:45) •God's plan for redemption (1 Cor. 15:1-8) •Blood -> sacrifice/atonement (Rom. 5:9) Cross -> suffering/passion (Acts 3:18; 17:3; Heb. 13:12)

So What? •Why did Jesus die? Propitiation – satisfy God's justice (Rom. 3:21-26; Heb. 2:17; 1 John 2:2; 4:10) As our vicarious sacrifice, Jesus provided the means of atonement, removal of sin, and establishment of righteousness

So What?

 Accepting Jesus' death in our place has serious implications for our lives • "and He died for all, so that they who live might no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died and rose again on their behalf." (2 Cor. 5:15; cf. 1 Pet. 2:24)

So What? "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me" (Mark 8:34)
