 - Gen. 2:18-23
 - "Now the man called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all the living." (Gen. 3:20)

The Purpose of Motherhood

• "God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. God blessed them; and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it;..." (Gen. 1:27-28)

 "Now the man had relations with his wife Eve, and she conceived and gave birth to Cain, and she said, 'I have gotten a manchild with the help of the Lord." (Gen. 4:1)

• "I will greatly multiply Your pain in childbirth, In pain you will bring forth children" (Gen. 3:16)

The Pain of Motherhood

 "Whenever a woman is in labor she has pain, because her hour has come; but when she gives birth to the child, she no longer remembers the anguish because of the joy that a child has been born into the world." (John 16:21)

- 1. It produces sinners
 - The first child ever born rejected God and committed murder (Gen. 4:3-8)
 - "Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great on the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." (Gen. 6:5)

- 2. They don't (always) listen
 - Therefore God commands: "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be prolonged in the land which the Lord your God gives you." (Ex. 20:12; Deut. 5:16; Eph. 6:1; cf. Col. 3:20)

- 2. They don't (always) listen
 - "Every one of you shall reverence his mother and his father" (Lev. 19:3)
 - "He who curses his father or his mother shall surely be put to death." (Ex. 21:17)

- 2. They don't (always) listen
 - "The eye that mocks a father
 - And scorns a mother,
 - The ravens of the valley will pick it out,
 - And the young eagles will eat it."
 - (Prov. 30:17)

- 2. They don't (always) listen
 - Prov. 23:22-25
 - •As parents, we need to be loving, gracious, and *consistent*

- 3. Its hard to let go
 - Prov. 31:1-3
 - •V. 3, according to my mother: "Do not give your strength to women [other than me, because none of them are good enough for *my* son!]"

- 3. Its hard to let go
 - Gen. 2:24 in the NASB: "For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother, and be joined to his wife; and they shall become one flesh."

- 3. Its hard to let go
 - Gen. 2:24 according to my mother: "It is understandable that a man might desire to leave his father and be united to a wife, but he better not even think of actually leaving his mother."

- 3. Its hard to let go
 - Gen. 2:24 according to me (20's): "If a man ever has any hope of even finding a wife, let alone being united with one, for this reason he better leave his father and his mother."
