# Type / Foreshadowing

- Nehemiah, a type of Christ
  - –Zeal
  - -Praying
  - -Reverence
  - -Justice
  - -Determination

- Nehemiah was born in the *captivity* —He had never been to Jerusalem
- See Neh. 1:1-11
  - Great zeal for Jerusalem (*the wall*)
    He knew the God, the history, and the law of Israel

• Four months later... (2:1-8) -Being sad was dangerous -The king stopped the rebuilding of Jerusalem years before (Ezra 4:21) -Nehemiah tactfully appealed to honor and respect (2:3)

- Nehemiah 13
  - -House-keeping (8)
  - -Reprimanding the officials (11)
  - -Reprimanding the nobles (17)
  - -Threatening the Sabbath-breakers
    - (21)

• Nehemiah 13

–"So I contended with them and cursed them and struck some of them and pulled out their hair, and made them swear by God…" (25)

## Jesus' Zeal

 Jesus made a scourge and drove the sellers and money changers out of the temple (John 2:13-22) -"His disciples remembered that it was written, 'ZEAL FOR YOUR HOUSE WILL CONSUME ME." (John 2:17)

## Jesus' Zeal

- Jesus had stern words for the scribes and Pharisees (see Matthew 23) –"Woe!" => indignation!
  - –"Jerusalem, Jerusalem… How often I wanted to gather your children together…" (23:37)

# Nehemiah's Praying

- "…I was fasting and praying before the God of heaven" (1:4)
- "So I prayed to the God of heaven."
   (2:4b)
- "But we prayed to our God" (4:9a)

# Nehemiah's Praying

- "Hear, O our God, how we are despised!" (4:4; cf. 6:14; 13:29)
  "Remember me, O my God…" (5:19; 13:14, 22, 31)
- "But now, O God, strengthen my hands." (6:9)

# Jesus' Praying

 "In the early morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house, and went away to a secluded place, and was praying there." (Mark 1:35)

# Jesus' Praying

- "But Jesus Himself would often slip away to the wilderness and pray." (Luke 5:16)
- "...while Jesus was praying in a certain place" -> "Lord, teach us to pray..." (Luke 11:1-13)

## Nehemiah's Reverence

- "the great and awesome God" (1:5)
  "...should you not walk in the fear of our God ...?" (5:9)
- He did not domineer the people "because of the fear of God" (5:15)
  Condemned unfaithfulness (13:26-27)

## Jesus' Reverence

- "Do not fear those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." (Matt. 10:28)
- "…I always do the things that are pleasing to Him." (John 8:29)

#### Nehemiah's Justice

- The rich were taking advantage of the poor (Neh. 5:1-5; cf. Ex. 22:25)
- In his zeal, Nehemiah sought justice for the oppressed (5:6-13)
   —And he modelled it! (5:14-19)

#### Jesus' Justice

- Isa. 9:6-7
  - -A child will sit on the throne of David and minister with justice and righteousness thru the zeal of the LORD of hosts

## Nehemiah's Determination

- He waited 4 months to present his proposal to the king (1:1 -> 2:1)
- Once in Jerusalem, he started right away (2:11)
- In spite of opposition, the wall was rebuilt in 52 days (6:15)

# Nehemiah's Determination

Just Like Jesus: • Opposition: -Mockery (4:1-3) Matt. 27:27-44 -Threats (4:7-8) Luke 13:31-33 -Traps (6:1-4) Matt. 22:15-22 -Lies (6:5-9) Mark 14:53-60 -Temptation (6:10-14)Matt. 4:1-4

# Jesus' Determination

 "For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me." (John 6:38; cf. 4:34; 5:30; Heb. 10:9; Ps. 40:7-8) -Obedient even to death (Phil. 2:8) -He accomplished it! (John 19:28)

## So What?

- Do you think people prayed that Jesus would not be crucified?
- "It is dangerous to have zeal without knowledge, and the one who acts hastily makes poor choices." (Prov. 19:2 NET)

# So What?

- We need to be all in on living for God
- But our zeal needs two guardrails:
  - truth and perspective
    - We need to make sure we are on-board with God's plan firstNote: His plan may differ from ours

# So What?

- God uses even man's sinful choices to accomplish His purposes (E.g. - 2 Sam. 24:1)
- We must renew our minds with God's word to know Him, His character, and His plan, and then trust Him
